Biographies

Kevin McMillan is one of the most respected lyric baritones and vocal pedagogues of his generation. His performing career has spanned over 30 years with more than 800 concerts, 16 professional recordings, a Grammy award, a Gramophone award and numerous Juno award nominations. Critics have praised his "elegant voice" and "singularly remarkable interpretive skills" in appearances with almost every major North American orchestra - including the New York Philharmonic, the Boston Symphony, the Cleveland Orchestra, the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the San Francisco Symphony - under conductors such as Norrington, Blomstedt, Lopez-Cobos, Davis, Järvi, Dutoit, Rilling and the late Kurt Masur, Pierre Boulez, Robert Shaw and Frühbeck de Burgos. His *Carmina burana* recording with Herbert Blomstedt and the San Francisco Symphony received a Grammy award.

After schooling in Canada at the University of Guelph and Western University, he attained a Master's degree from the Juilliard School. He is a founding member of PAVA - the Pan-American Vocology Association.

Gabriel Dobner's recordings with Cornelia Kallisch have won high praise, with the BBC Magazine referring to him as a "master among Lieder pianists". Upon receiving a German scholarship to study Lied accompanying in Munich with Helmut Deutsch, Gabriel Dobner moved to Augsburg. After winning the pianist's prize in the International Hans Pfitzner Lieder Competition in Munich, he established himself as a successful collaborative pianist and began appearing with such notable singers as René Kollo, Cornelia Kallisch, Gerhard Siegel, and Kevin McMillan. He has since performed in many of Europe's most prestigious concert venues. His teachers include Leonard Hokanson, Ludmila Lazar, and James Tocco.
