## Biographies

**Donald A. Lee III**, winner of the 2013 Virginia MTNA and 2014 JMU Concerto/Aria competitions, is a sophomore at James Madison University, where he studies under the tutelage of Dr. Eric Ruple. He began playing the piano at the age of five with Ann Boggs. He has since studied other instruments, including voice, cello, percussion and the tuba, to name a few. Lee has had the opportunity to play in many special events at the Forbes Center at JMU, including an alumni reception given in honor of the inauguration of President Alger. He plans to pursue piano performance at a major conservatory after he graduates, eventually earning his D.M.A. in piano performance.

**Clara Mannino** is pursuing a master's degree in flute performance at JMU with Dr. Beth Chandler. She earned her bachelor's degree in flute performance from Central Washington University studying with Dr. Hal Ott. She won the 2014 Flute Society of Washington Masterclass Competition, the 2012 CWU Concerto Competition, and the 2011 MusicFest Northwest Young Artist Competition soloing with the Spokane Symphony. Mannino is praised for her "beautiful, sparkling tone," "clean technique," and "charismatic presence."
