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Biography

Eric Ruple enjoys an active career as a soloist, chamber musician, and teacher. He has performed several times at the Kennedy Center in Washington D.C.: including a solo concert of the music of Beethoven. His solo performances have also included concerts in New York's "Steinway Hall" the American Liszt Society Festival, and throughout Virginia and the mid-Atlantic region. He is the principal keyboard player for the Virginia Symphony (including a recording of the Mahler Symphony #8). He is a regular guest adjudicator for the City Music Festival in Hong Kong, China. He has taught and performed solo and chamber music at "Opusfest" in the Philippines. In addition, he will be featured with JMU horn professor Ian Zook in a new recording of sonatas for French horn and piano to be released in 2018.

Dr. Ruple has been on the James Madison University music faculty since 1987. He is a Steinway Artist and MTNA Nationally Certified Teacher. In addition to teaching at JMU and frequent turns as an adjudicator through the region, Dr. Ruple has taught in a variety of other settings, including his summer work as a faculty member at the Virginia Governor's School for the Visual and Performing Arts. He has also served as Coordinator of the Piano Area as well as Interim Director of the School of Music.
