The Florida State University Singers, Dr. Kevin Fenton, *Director*

University Singers, founded in 1948 by Dr. Wiley Housewright, is the premier undergraduate touring choir at Florida State University. The auditioned choir consists mostly of students majoring in music. During its rich history, University Singers has performed with remarkable musicians Simon Halsey, Krzysztof Penderecki, Bobby McFerrin, Sir David Willcocks, Aaron Copland, Norman Dello Joio, Billy Taylor, and the esteemed Atlanta Symphony conductor Robert Shaw. During the past 17 years, University Singers has been invited to perform at national and regional conventions of the Music Educators National Conference and the American Choral Directors Association, including their performance at the national conventions of ACDA in 2013 and 2007. Recent tours have included performances throughout the Southeastern United States and Central Europe. In 2015, the members of University Singers represented the United States in the Choral Festival celebrating the 500th anniversary of the City of Arecibo, Puerto Rico, and in 2016, they participated in AVoice4Peace concerts with choirs throughout the United Kingdom. The choir has produced five recordings: Making Music Together as One; Now Let Us Sing!; Reflections 2003-2006, Songs of Hope and Inspiration; and Garnet and Gold: A Look at the Nineties.

Several distinguished conductors have led the University Singers in its 66-year history, including Walter James, Joseph Flummerfelt, Clayton Krehbiel and André Thomas. Kevin Fenton has carried on traditions established by these outstanding conductors since 2000.

Kevin Fenton is professor of choral conducting and ensembles at Florida State University where he conducts the FSU University Singers and Chamber Choir. He has conducted the Virginia Tech Meistersingers (1998), the University Singers (2013, 2007, 2006, 2003, 2002) and the Festival Singers of Florida (2012) in performances at regional and national conventions of ACDA and NAfME. A champion of new music, Dr. Fenton has conducted over 30 premiere performances—most recently Skip Stradtman's "Look Who Gathers at Christ's Table" and "Amazing Grace" (2015); Troy Robertson's "We are the Music Makers" (2014) and "This Mystery" (2012); Eric Barnum's "In Paradisum" (2010); Sydney Guillame's "Au-Déla du Chagrin" (2010); Clifton Callender's "Reasons to Learn to Sing" (2010); and "The Soul's Passing" (2008) by Dominick DiOrio.

Dr. Fenton has conducted choirs in 35 states, including 24 all-state choirs. Additionally, he has conducted the ACDA Southern Division High School Honor Choir (2008), the Beijing International Choral Festival Choir with China's People's Liberation Orchestra (2007) and the Dublin International Choral Festival (2016).

Dr. Fenton teaches graduate and undergraduate courses in choral literature and choral conducting. His textbook, Foundations of Choral Conducting, has been adopted throughout the country. He is a recipient of the Florida State University Teaching Award for Excellence, the Wayne Hugoboom Distinguished Florida Service Award, and the Gamma Mu Chapter of Delta Omicron Music Professor of the Year. He recently taught at the Kenya Conservatoire of Music as a Fulbright Specialist to Sub-Saharan Africa—and he is in his ninth year as artistic director of the Festival Singers of Florida, a choir of music educators and performers based in Orlando dedicated to "inspiring and engaging through impassioned singing."
