Synopsis

Act 1

Busily preparing for the arrival of Sir Joseph Porter, the sailors on the HMS *Pinafore* can't help but stop for a few diversions. We are quickly introduced to Little Buttercup, who is busy selling ribbons, peppermint drops, and anything else that can rouse the interest of the sailors. Ralph Rackstraw shares his woes that he is in love with the Captain's daughter, Josephine! All of his messmates know that there is little hope for Ralph's love to come to fruition, as Josephine is of a much higher social rank. All members of the crew rise to the occasion of their Captain joining them on deck. Soon after, the boats containing Sir Joseph and his entourage of female relatives that follow him wherever he goes are spotted being oared in from sea. Amidst the gaggle, we learn that Josephine is to wed Sir Joseph - and that Sir Joseph has risen to the top of the Navy in a rather peculiar way. Finally, Ralph summons the nerve to tell Josephine of his love - only to be rejected and told that his social rank is far below hers... But is that enough to keep them apart?

Act 2

After a heartfelt song to the moon sung by the Captain, we discover that there is another possible love connection brewing between the Captain and Little Buttercup! The Captain has barely told Little Buttercup that they can only be friends due to their disparity in social rank, when Sir Joseph enters, loudly complaining that Josephine doesn't seem interested enough in his suit! The Captain reassures him, and they hatch a plan to ensnare Josephine and quickly exit. Josephine sings about her struggle between love and rank, which is followed by a delightful trio where Sir Joseph, Josephine and the Captain comment about the situation in question. As Josephine dances off, Dick Deadeye enters to tell the Captain distressing news of Ralph and Josephine's plans to elope! As the drama unfolds, Little Buttercup reveals the secret that she has been keeping for decades: she switched the Captain and Ralph at birth! Now that the social hierarchy has self-corrected, will we have a happy ending? We will have to see...
