### **Cory Band**

Cory Band in the most consistently successful contesting brass band in contesting history. It is the current Grand Slam Champion, having won the European, British Open, and National Championships of Great Britain in 2019 for the second time in three years.

The world's No. 1-ranked band for 13 consecutive years, Cory made history in 2016 by winning an elusive Grand Slam and becoming the first band in history to be quadruple champions - simultaneously holding the National, Open, European, and Brass in Concert titles. This accomplishment cemented a remarkable 10 consecutive years at the top of the world rankings. However, the band has a long and illustrious history. Formed in 1884, it originally bore the name "Ton Temperance." In 1895, Sir Clifford Cory, the local colliery owner, heard the band and offered to provide financial assistance, resulting in the band's change of name to Cory.

In 1980, the band became European Champions for the first time. In 1984, its centenary year, Cory won the third in a hat trick of National titles at the Royal Albert Hall, London, conducted by the charismatic Major Arthur Kenney. In 2000, the band achieved an historic double by winning both the Nationals and—for the first time in its history—the British Open, conducted by Dr. Robert Childs. In 2008–2010, the band achieved a hat trick of European Brass Band Champion titles.

Since 2012, the band has been conducted by Philip Harper and has won another three European titles (2019, 2016, 2013), three Nationals (2016, 2015 and 2013), five Brass in Concert titles (2018, 2016, 2015, 2013, 2012), and two British Open titles (2018, 2016). In 2014, it became the inaugural winner of TV channel S4C's Band Cymru program and repeated this achievement in 2018. It toured Australia in 2013 and the U.S. in February 2016, 40 years after its last visit.

The Cory Band has also developed musically outside of the contest field. In 2000, it was appointed as resident ensemble to the Royal Welsh College of Music & Drama together with the BBC National Orchestra of Wales; in the same year, it appointed Dr. John Pickard as composer-in-residence. John Pickard's tenure with the band ended in July 2005 when the band made history by giving the premiere performance of Pickard's Gaia Symphony at the prestigious Cheltenham International Festival. Broadcast live on Radio 3, the Symphony lasted over an hour and is currently the largest scale original work in the repertory.

The band is dedicated to new music, raising the profile of the brass band genre and keeping music alive in Wales. It has an active commissioning policy, and has performed works by many of Britain's leading composers: John McCabe, Judith Bingham, Elgar Howarth, Edward Gregson, Alun Hoddinott, Karl Jenkins, Gareth Wood, David Bedford, to name but a few. The band's current composer-in-residence is Christopher Bond.

The Cory Band is recognized as one the Principality's finest and most innovative music ensembles. Its numerous CD recordings and live concert performances have received worldwide acclaim.
