THE JMU PERCUSSION ENSEMBLE encompasses a number of performing groups, representing many styles of music. The ensembles consist of more than twenty students, some of who have been selected as performers in the All-American College Marching Show Bands and Orchestra at Disneyland and the Walt Disney World/Epcot Center, as well as at Busch Gardens and Kings Dominion. Several of its members have also been involved with drum and bugle corps, performing with such groups as Carolina Crown, Crossmen, Bluecoats, and the Cadets of Bergen County. The ensemble has performed throughout the East Coast, including concerts at the Virginia Music Educators Association Convention and Virginia Days of Percussion, and was selected to perform a feature concert at the Percussive Arts Society International Convention in Philadelphia. Most recently the ensemble created two podcast videos featured on the VicFirth.com website, and toured Virginia, West Virginia, Maryland and Pennsylvania. The group was chosen to perform the keynote concert at the 2003 National Conference on Percussion Pedagogy at the University of North Carolina in Greensboro. In 2004 the ensemble won the small ensemble contest at PASIC held in Nashville, TN and in the spring of 2006, 2007 and 2008 they won the NABBA Adult Class Percussion Ensemble Contest held in Louisville KY. The marching ensemble/Marching Royal Dukes have performed at the Spartan Marching Percussion Festival in Chicago, Percussive Arts Society International Conventions in Knoxville, TN, Washington DC, and at the BOA Marching Percussion Festival.

the 1998 Leigh Howard Stevens International Marimba Competition and in 1999 toured Taiwan as a soloist, performing in three of the country's largest concert halls, and presenting a clinic at the National Institute for the Arts in Taipei.

MARLON FOSTER* teaches studio percussion and drumset. He has conducted workshops involving percussion and jazz band rhythm sections throughout Virginia. He was a member of the U.S. Air Force Band at Langley Air Force Base and is currently the director of bands at Skyline Middle School.

RICK DELONEY*, coordinator of Marching Percussion, is a former member of the Velvet Knights Drum Corps. He has instructed several marching percussion programs and served as an adjudicator in Virginia and Maryland. He was also an instructor for the Magic of Orlando Drum Corps, Orlando Florida.
